

Program. These groups provide wrap around services for our communities' most vulnerable neighbors. Mahalo, Darsha!




Meet Cedric!

Update on the Rector Search Process, by Rev. Canon Sandy Graham, Canon to the Bishop

I hope everyone has had the chance to see the parish profile prepared by the Search Committee and approved by the Vestry – it truly is fantastic. I know they worked hard on it, and it really shows. The wording has a wonderful flow which urges the reader to keep going, the ministries and context of St. Elizabeth are perfectly presented, the photos are just right, and the whole thing looks beautiful! When I work with

Vestries, Bishop's Committees, and Search Committees, I always provide profile examples for them to look at. St. Elizabeth's latest profile is so good that it has become one of my prime examples (as the newly formed Search Committee at St. Peter's can attest).

We are now in a time of waiting and holy expectation. Your Search Committee and Vestry have wisely set the application deadline after Easter, knowing that active clergy will likely have been quite busy leading up to and through Easter. I have been receiving some exciting applicants so far, and have had Zoom and phone calls many more interested clergy who are still discerning a possible call. After doing a quick "red flag" check on each of the candidates. I will meet with the Search Committee just after the April 15th application deadline to "introduce" them to all of your possible candidates. The Search Committee will need some time to go over all of the paperwork, but will then start the difficult task of narrowing down potential

candidates. Please understand that information about individual candidates must be kept confidential. The Episcopal Church community is very interconnected, and it could do irrevocable harm to a priest's current ministry if their current parish found out too soon that they were in a search. After all, the whole process takes quite a bit of time, and only one priest among the applicants will be ultimately chosen to join you in your ministry.

The Search Committee will undoubtedly give you more updates, but please understand the need for confidentiality when it comes to the candidates. They can, however, be transparent about the process itself, the phases they're in and what the timeline ahead might look like.

So take some time to pray for those priests who might feel a pull to enter their name for consideration, and take some time to thank a Search Committee member for their great work so far and their commitment to St. Elizabeth's.
