Honoring Our Kupuna & History

St. Elizabeth's unique, rich legacy and history lives through our elders -- many of whom descend from the parish founders! Kupuna like Mrs. Patsy Ching (pictured) generously share their memories of what church life was like when the "new building" was constructed in 1952. Our Christian faith is evident through the use of stylized Tudor Gothic elements, yet with equal subtlety the building reflects our congregation's Chinese heritage and Hawai`i's tropic balm. Masonry screens with cross patterns derive from Chinese architectural traditions, and the prominent, narrow entrance, although centered on the body of the

building, is not aligned with the front gate, in accord with feng shui concepts. (Don J. Hibbard article.) Mrs. Ching fondly recalls how family & community life revolved around St. E.'s with sports teams, a ladies' gardening club, men's bible study, and camping trips. She even remembers how Mrs. Shim (Fr. Shim's wife) would cook breakfast on Sundays and feed hungry bellies before Mass at the Rectory! Mrs. Ching is one of several kupuna who can share our history and talk about the ways St. Elizabeth's grew as a parish by serving our members and creating community. What are your ideas to build community at St. E.'s? Let's do it!
